

President's Message

Iowa ACEP Members,

With my first letter as your president this year, I want to share a bit of my background and prompt you with a thought on the role of emergency medicine. I grew up in Ames under the shadows of Jack Trice Stadium and McFarland Clinic.

For those of you in the area, I contributed to most of the landscaping you'll see at the clinic in my high school summers, and I'm convinced that Rod the maintenance guy was the hardest working person in that organization. I studied Biology and Philosophy at Notre Dame, which is how I find myself sitting on the IMS Law and Ethics Committee and ACEP Ethics Committee. Seven years of medical school and residency in Iowa City led me now to Des Moines, where I work at UnityPoint as the Associate Medical Director of our three ED's. I'm looking forward to this opportunity as President of Iowa ACEP to help advance the care of our patients and the practice of emergency medicine in our state during these tumultuous and critical times.

As all of us who work in emergency medicine appreciate that there seems to be a tension between the focus of our training in managing medical emergencies and the increasing reliance on the ED as a panacea for the socioeconomically disenfranchised, frustrations with a dis-coordinated and dysfunctional healthcare insurance marketplace, diagnostic uncertainty, and risk mitigation. We all feel that conflict as we struggle to reconcile what is being asked of us from society and the healthcare community with increasingly constrained resources (who else is tracking CT utilization and at the same time fielding referrals to the ED for “a scan”?).

Emergency medicine, however, in the 1970’s was born out of this kind of necessity – I’d submit it is the only grassroots specialty, homegrown by the medical staff to fill a critical void in patients’ needs. And to that ethos society has continued to turn for refuge and help with chronic mental illness, substance abuse, social and legal conflicts, and the dwindling aged. Sometimes it feels like the label of “emergency medicine” doesn’t capture all that we do any more.

Recently in Des Moines, we crafted a mission statement and values for our emergency departments to try to encapsulate this reality. We hold it up to our colleagues, our leaders, and ourselves as evidence of the important role we play not just in the care of our critically-ill patients but also in society at-large. When we are approached to be the next incremental solution to a challenge that isn’t easily remedied through the hospital, clinics, or community programs, we turn to this mission and these values to help shape and support our response. If you haven’t yet, I’d encourage you and your emergency department to do similar: sit down together (preferably over a beverage) and see if you can articulate the mission and values you aspire to and want to shape your practice. I would love to hear what you come up with.
